Course Description	This is the second semester, pre-collegiate course for high school juniors and seniors offered through the University of Colorado Denver. As part of the course requirement, students will participate in field experience training and a field experience working with young children. Depending on schedules and availability, this field experience will take place at a local elementary school during class time. This course examines the sociological issues related to urban schools, communities, and teaching and provides an overview of such topics as school culture, diversity, ethnicity, and social realities in American schools. Students will critically examine current education issues that affect their lives, their local community, and P-12 classrooms throughout the state and the country. Throughout this course, we will examine achievement data (local, state and national) by gender, race, ethnicity, English language proficiency, and program type (gifted/ talented, special education, honors, Advanced Placement, etc.) and use this analysis to generate questions, offer solutions, and engage in critical dialogue about educational inequalities and educational justice.
